Re: State Certification of Residential Building Codes
Regarding Energy Efficiency

Dear Mr. Risser:

In response to the U.S. Department of Energy's July 20, 2011 notice of determination in the Federal Register regarding the 2009 International Energy Conservation Code, Alabama certifies that it has reviewed and adopted the provisions of its Alabama Energy and Residential Code to include the requirement for residential buildings to comply with the 2009 International Residential Code, including the Energy Chapter with amendments. Amendments include adoption of the Insulation and Fenestration requirements of the 2009 IECC. The Alabama Energy and Residential Codes Board adopted this code on March 12, 2012. The code was advertised and a public hearing held. The code was formally included as part of the *Alabama Administrative Code* in May of 2012 and became effective October 1, 2012.

In response to the U.S. Department of Energy's May 17, 2012 notice of determination in the Federal Register regarding the 2012 IECC, Alabama requests a twelve-month extension until July 2014, to certify that the provisions of the Alabama Energy and Residential Code regarding energy efficiency meets or exceeds this code. Alabama has only recently adopted the first *mandatory* energy codes in the state. An extension would allow jurisdictions the time needed to develop implementation and enforcement protocols under the currently adopted code before having to adjust to an updated version.
